




About CUSD

Foundations for Success

Students learn and apply foundational skills within and across multiple content areas to support deeper learning and reach mastery.

Each child is known, connected, and included in a network of caring adults, peers and community. Students learn to be compassionate, kind friends and citizens who value the diversity of our community and world.


What We Value






Budget Overview for the 2021-22 School Year




This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Cupertino Union Elementary School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

CUSD Student Enrollment




Cost of Running School Per Student Per Year







Student Performance Highlights

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Last spring's academic assessment results indicate strong progress:


- 78% of K-5 students met end of the year reading benchmarks using local measures (Rigby/Literably), compared to 74% in Spring 2019
- **82%** of students in Grades 3-8 **met** CAASPP grade level standards in English Language Arts (similar to 85% in spring 2019*)
- 87% of K-8 students met end of year math benchmarks on i-Ready, compared to 78% at the start of the 2020-2021 year
- 84% of students in Grades 3-8 met CAASPP grade level standards in Mathematics (similar to 86% in spring 2019*)
- Eighth graders finished strong! 86% of our 8th graders met or exceeded CAASPP grade level standards in both Math and English Language Arts (on par with 86% math and 87% ELA in 2019)

NEW Social-Emotional Learning Assessment: In the area of **self-efficacy**, (How much students believe they can succeed in achieving academic outcomes), students in grades 3-8 scored at the **80-90th%ile nationally**, increasing favorable responses by 3% since fall 2020.

Tier 3: Intensive support for students with the highest needs


• Examples: 1:1 Mental Health Support; Intensive reading instruction






