Talk on Low-Incidence Disabilities

If you are a parent of a student with a vision, hearing, or orthopedic disability, please consider attending this talk for parents on March 28 at 7pm at Sedgewick Elementary School. Professionals will share information on eligibility for services, and an outline of the services provided. They will also discuss some specific types of low incidence disabilities that are covered, and how these influence students in their classroom curriculum.
